

Brief History of MV

First Main Shrine Hall (1960)

- Founded by the late Bhante M M Jayaweera Mahanayaka Mahāthera (Bhante Mahaweera), a visionary leader who rendered immeasurable services to the cause of Buddhism in Singapore and led MV for 42 years.
- The first 2-storey temple was built in the current location in 1960.
- The land where MV sits today was donated by the late Madam Chew Quee Neo, a Paranakan Chinese lady who was a Buddhist and vegetarian, in 1959 after she knew that Bhante Mahaweera was a vegetarian.
- Bhante Mahaweera planted a sapling of the Maha Bodhi tree from Anuradhapura (the ancient city of Sri Lanka), given to him by the first Prime Minister of Sri Lanka.




Saduwardena Shield

- A Sunday Dhamma School was formalised based on the syllabi of the Young Men's Buddhist Association (YMBA) of Colombo by Bhante Mahaweera in 1960. The School achieved the best results among the English-medium Dhamma classes in the world in its first year of participating in the examinations, in 1961, and repeatedly in 1962 and 1963. A replica of the Saduwardena Shield was thus awarded to MV for permanent display.
- The first Sima House was built in 1966. On the opening ceremony of the Sima House, a Buddha's image and a Buddha's footprint (displayed in the main Shrine Hall) brought in from Thailand were both unveiled on the same day.
- The 3-storey extension building was completed in 1983 to cater to the rapidly expanding Sunday Dhamma classes.

Extension Building (1983)

 The Sima House was re-consecrated to the 3rd storey of the new extension building on 23 September 1983 and has remained there since.



 The Buddhist and Pali College of Singapore started in September 1993.



- Shrine Hall A new (the current one) was completed in 1994 to cater to a larger congregation the for religious conduct of activities. It was officially opened by Dr. Wee Kim Wee, Singapore's former President, on 11 July 1999.
- A replica of the original Sanchi Gate in India was also erected at the entrance to MV and was opened by His Excellency, Mr, Nirmal Wijayaratne, High Commissioner of Sri Lanka to Singapore in 1999.

2. On MV's anniversary celebration on 31 March, the Pirit Mandapaya (Miniature Shrine) is set up in the main Shrine Hall for the overnight chanting by the monks and devotees rejoice to the Dhamma. encourage the Sangha and give protection and blessings to the devotees.

1. Buddha's relic and Arahant

Sivali's relic are brought

Items, representing the Triple Gem to bring merits and blessings to all beings, were placed in the Miniature Shrine. These include:

- A casket of the sacred Relic of the Buddha
- A scroll of the Catubhanarara Paritta Sutta (the Book of Protection) inscribed on Ola leaves. The recitation of it evokes protection for all beings.
- Water and threads which are used for blessings.

Sacred Trees



 We can find the Sala (Sal) tree, which played a special role in the life of Gotama Buddha in MV. Prince Siddhartha was born with his mother, Queen Maya, holding on to a branch of this tree; and the Buddha lied down in

between two Sala trees during his Mahāparinibbāna.

4. The original Bodhi tree in MV was a sapling from the Bodhi tree which was brought by Ven. Sanghamitta to Anurādhapura, the ancient city of Sri Lanka, where it was planted by the King, Devanampiya Tissa. To treat a termite infection issue, the original MV Bodhi tree was relocated. A sapling was taken to be planted at the current location (see photograph above).



5. A Naga Puspa tree stands beside the original MV Bodhi tree (another one is found outside the Mangala Hall). It is believed to be the chosen species of tree under which the future Buddha, Metteyya (Pali) or Maitreya (Sanskrit) will gain Enlightenment.

Buddhist Art and Architecture

6. There is an array of Buddhist art and architecture in MV. Besides a replica of the original Sanchi Gate in India, there are (a) murals; (b) moonstones; and (c) guardstones.





- The murals were painted in 1962, 1985 and 1992, featuring stories on the life and perfections of the Buddha, Jataka stories, Kaleidoscopic arrangements of the Buddhist art motifs etc.
- The Ajanta-Sigiri tradition of painting was used for the 9-metre diameter lotus motifs on the ceiling of the Shrine Hall, Jataka stories on Level 2 as well as the ten perfections of the Buddha and decorative motifs on Level 3.



- The semi-circular moonstone, a common architectural feature in many Theravada Buddhist temples in Sri Lanka, symbolises Samsara. Walking over the moonstone at the entrance into the temple symbolises crossing from the mundane world to reach a higher plane, to transcend Samsaric existence and away from birth, decay, illhealth and death.
- The Guardstones are commonly found at the entrances of royal and religious buildings in Sri Lanka, on either side of the staircase beside the moonstone, guarding the entrance to the Shrine Hall.
- In MV, there is another moonstone at the entrance to the Bodhi tree where there is also a statue of the Buddha image.



Bhante M M Jayaweera Mahanayaka Mahāthera passed away on 12 June 2002. A Cetiya was built for his 100th day memorial and the bronze-life-size statue of Bhante was installed on 21 September 2002. His relics were buried in the ground where his status stands.

Although Bhante Mahaweera may not be with us, we will always remember the legacy he left behind.

About Poh Ming Tse Temple (PMT)



The temple of illumination, or the temple of abundant brightness



A non-sectarian platform to support all teachings of the Buddha



The logo is inspired by the Sanskrit word 'pāramitā', which means 'perfection', but can also mean "to cross to the other shore".

The six pāramitās are generosity, morality, patience, diligence, concentration and wisdom.

Brief History of PMT



PMT was founded in 1934. The founder of the temple, Upasika Chen Miao Hua ('Upasika' refers to a lay female Buddhist), later entrusted the temple to Upasika Lin Miao Deng.



Expanded to include the neighbour's bungalow in 1980s.



The current temple comprised a 3-storey building and a basement, was completed in end 2009.

Do you know?



1. A key feature of PMT's external façade is the 12-metre-high curved glass curtain wall, reminiscent of a traditional Chinese scroll. Each glass panel is unique and finding a replacement piece is tough. The bamboo decalcomania depicted on the "scroll" is symbolic of the Buddhists' aspiration to reach the stage of "emptiness", or Nibbāna. The scripture which was inscribed on the glass wall is the Great Compassion Mantra, 大悲咒.



2. This is the adjacent bungalow which now serves as a living quarter for resident sangha members. There is also a shrine hall where devotees are welcome to pay their respects and make offerings of joss sticks.







3. The main hall is located on the third floor. Here, one can find a large white marble Buddha statue which was custom-made in China, using 5 tonnes of marble from India.



4. The library on the first floor is the venue for the BPC Diploma classes. Just outside the library is the Metteyya Bodhisatta (Pali) or Maitreya Bodhisattva (Sanskrit). Notice the



candles on the right? Devotees may purchase them to make offerings to Bodhisatta.





5. The *Hall of Gratitude*, located in the basement, provides a place to house ancestral tablets, emphasising the importance of filial piety.




